APPLICATION AND ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Students must fulfill all prerequisites and apply in their fifth semester at Berkeley <u>or</u> before accumulating 80 units (post-high school) -- whichever comes second. Failure to apply on-time will make a student ineligible for the major. Students may apply with their last prerequisite course(s) inprogress.
- 2. Students must earn a <u>minimum grade of C (2.0) or higher in each of the prerequisite courses taken at</u>

 Berkeley to be admitted to the economics major.

PREREQUISITES FOR ADMISSION TO THE ECONOMICS MAJOR

- ONE course required of Introduction to Economics (choose one):
 - o ECON 1 or ECON 2
- TWO courses required of Calculus:
 - o MATH 1A or MATH 16A and
 - MATH 1B or MATH 16B
- ONE course required of Introduction to Statistics (choose one):
 - STAT 20, STAT 21, STAT W21, STAT 88/DATA C88S, STAT 131A, STAT 135, or STAT/DATA C140
- **TWO** out of three core courses required of Intermediate Economic Theory or Econometrics (choose two for admission, all three are required to graduate):
 - ECON 100A or ECON 101A*
 - ECON 100B or ECON 101B**
 - o ECON 140 or ECON 141

Quantitative Residency Requirement

At least one prerequisite in math or statistics must be completed at UC Berkeley.

*Students who wish to take ECON 101A instead of ECON 100A must successfully complete MATH 53 first.

UPPER DIVISION MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

- **THREE** Core courses (recommended to complete *before* electives):
 - ECON 100A or ECON 101A*
 - ECON 100B or ECON 101B**
 - o **ECON 140** *or* **ECON 141**
- <u>FIVE</u> Upper Division electives chosen from a list of approved Economics electives
