A minimum grade of C (2.0) or higher in each prerequisite course taken at Berkeley is also required to be accepted to the major. - With this plan, students can apply to the major as early as their fourth semester with their last prerequisite(s) in-progress. Students should try to declare their major as early as possible to have higher priority when enrolling in courses offered by the economics department.

- Students are strongly advised to work with an Economics Advisor to determine a personal program plan. Your program plan will differ depending on previous credit received, your course schedule, and available offerings.
- With limited time in this plan, it is difficult to incorporate the Economics Honors Program. The Honors Program is not required for graduation. If you are interested in the honors program, please speak to an Economics Advisor to see if this is a possibility.
- *Math 53 is the prerequisite to enroll in Econ 101A, 101B, and 141, the more quantitatively rigorous versions of Econ 100A, 100B, and 140. These courses are recommended for students interested in research or pursuing a Ph.D. in Economics. Econ 100A/101A and 100B/101B can be taken in any order.
- **Other options to the Statistics prerequisite are: STAT 21, STAT W21, STAT 88/DATA C88S, STAT 131A, STAT 135, or STAT 140/DATA C140.
